





Draft Recommended Network

Transit Vision asked two transit planning questions in Phase II: how to balance ridership and coverage, and how much transit service does Memphis need? Public opinion on four proposed network maps resulted in the Draft Recommended Network, which increases bus frequency and still maintains coverage. The Draft Recommended Network has more frequent bus routes and increases job access by 39% within an hour for an average Memphian, 45% for minority residents and 49% for low income residents. An annual investment of an additional \$30 million is required to achieve this.





Memphis is poised to adopt a transit plan that promises a big economic splash, but first supporters must sell the general public on a \$30 million annual price tag before any transformation occurs

"Everyone in Memphis has an interest in a good, effective transit system," said Mayor Jim Strickland, already in promotion mode, "even if you never get on a



Officials expect a revamped transit system to get the greatest number of people to the greatest number of jobs while servicing existing corridors of commerce. By strengthening the bus system, they also tackle poverty, bolster talent retention and nurse the environment.

A draft of the transit plan, called Memphis 3.0 Transit Vision Draft Recommended Network, suggests that for \$30 million a year, Memphians will get around the city easier. And faster. Along some routes, buses will show up every 15 minutes, an industry standard.

Most MATA routes run every hour to 90 minutes now, and only a few MATA routes offer 30-minute frequency, with the exception of the Main Street trolley



Survey: Memphis 3.0 requests community feedback

Innovate Memphis and Memphis 3.0 are working to bring better transit to Memphis. The Draft Transit Vision shows what is possible in the next four years with new investment and a redesign of our bus system.

- 17,000 more jobs reachable in an hour by transit for the average Memphian—a 39% increase.

Introduction

The following questions ask you to think about a new bus network for Memphis compared to the existing system. This new bus network has a different way of connecting the city with bus routes and we want to know what you think about it

A key feature of the maps of each network is the frequency of service (how often a bus is coming). The frequency of service is shown by the color of the lines on the map.

What do the colors on the maps mean?

- Red lines mean a bus coming every 15 minutes.
- Purple lines mean a bus coming every 20 minutes.
- Blue lines mean a bus coming every 30 minutes.
- Green lines mean a bus coming every 60 minutes.
- Tan lines mean a bus coming every 75 to 120 minutes.



How Does Transit Affect You?

The first Existing Network map shows you today's transit network and how it connects Memphis. Notice the frequency of service. Most routes in today's network come infrequently. This means long waits when traveling.




The Draft Recommended Network map below shows how the Draft Recommended Network would connect Memphis. Many streets would have more frequent service. Many routes would change and some routes would go away, but nearly everyone who is near service today would be near service with this network.





